
Bop Stop

biographies

RACHEL BERNSTEIN has more than 25 years of teaching in both traditional and Suzuki cello methods, and in teaching general music to young children. She is certified in Suzuki cello books I through I0 and completed her practicum studies in 2012. After moving to Cleveland in 1998, Rachel became a member of "The Strings" chamber group with members of The Cleveland Orchestra, and has performed as a freelance musician. Ms. Bernstein's teachers include members of the Boston Symphony at the Tanglewood Institute and Anne Cole of Albuquerque, New Mexico. Rachel performed in a masterclass with the late Mistislav Rostropovich and as principal cellist under the baton of Leonard Bernstein at the Tanglewood Institute. She has also performed with composer and pianist Marc Neikrug as part of the Santa Fe Chamber Music series and Grammy award winner Marc Doss in recital at The Music Settlement.

RANDALL FUSCO is an active collaborative pianist who has performed with members of The Cleveland Orchestra, Chicago Symphony, Pittsburgh Symphony, and the Metropolitan Opera Orchestra. He has also recorded with numerous artists from Northeast Ohio. Mr. Fusco earned his degrees in piano performance from the Eastman School of Music, where he studied with Frank Glazer, Cecile Genhart and Barbara Lister-Sink.

IOANA MISSITS joined The Cleveland Orchestra's second violin section in 2000, after serving as a violinist in the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra. She previously was a member of the Michigan Opera Theatre Orchestra and the Grant Park Symphony Orchestra in Chicago. Born in Cluj, Romania, Ms. Missits has been a soloist for the National Young Artist Gala in Romania and with the Cluj Philharmonic Orchestra. She holds a bachelor's degree in music performance from Bowling Green State University and a master of music degree from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.

BETH WOODSIDE joined The Cleveland Orchestra in 1994. She studied with Josef Gingold (Cleveland Orchestra concertmaster, 1947–1960) and James Buswell at Indiana University, and with Peter Salaff at the Eastman School of Music. While at Indiana University, she gained an especially broad range of knowledge, studying contemporary music with Harvey Sollberger and the New Music Ensemble, and studying Bach and Mozart with the revered baroque violin professor, Stanley Ritchie. She is a former member of the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra and the New World Symphony and has collaborated with many other symphonic and chamber ensembles, including the Cleveland Chamber Collective, Cleveland Composer's Guild, Zurich Tonhalle Orchestra, and the Mainly Mozart Festival. Ms. Woodside teaches violin at The Music Settlement in University Circle, and acts as coach and coordinator for the Roxboro Middle School spelling program. For many years she also served on the board of Reaching Heights, an organization that supports Cleveland Heights - University Heights public schools. She enjoys playing chamber music with colleagues on recitals around NE Ohio.
